## \$16M Century Building set to bring 60 rental units to Downtown Pittsburgh

Financing is complete for Downtown's first mixed-income residential development. Located at 137 Seventh St., the \$16 million Century Building has been approved for \$515,155 in Affordable Housing Tax Credits from the Pennsylvania Housing Finance Agency.

The 78,000 square-foot, 12-story property will feature 60 units, including 565 square-foot loft studios and one- and two-bedroom apartments ranging in size from 700 to 1,020 square feet. Rents will range from \$450 to \$1,250 per month, depending on income level.

"What the <u>Cultural Trust</u> has done in the last 10 years has set the stage for this. We did 900 Penn Avenue and then <u>Penn Garrison</u> and that was all part of it. We saw where the greatest need was," says William Gatti with <u>TREK Development Group</u>, who purchased the building for \$3 million. "It was still theoretical until the building came along. It's very difficult to find the right building Downtown for residential. It's about price, location and physical make-up. This building had all of the ingredients and a motivated seller."

TREK, who will manage the property, will move its offices to the building's third floor, which will also include a business center, gym and management office. The second floor will house commercial tenants. Santa Monica-based <a href="Koning Eizenberg Architecture">Koning Eizenberg Architecture</a> is working on the project with Pittsburgh-based architects <a href="Mike Eversmeyer">Mike Eversmeyer</a> and Jason Roth. The project, which will feature a deck and green roof, will seek <a href="LEED-Silver certification">LEED-Silver certification</a>.

The project also received \$3.2 million from the Pittsburgh Cultural Trust, \$2.3 million from the URA, \$2.3 million from the <u>Strategic Investment Fund</u>, and \$750,000 from <u>Allegheny County Economic Development</u>. Construction will begin during the spring of 2008. Units will be ready for occupancy during the first quarter of 2009.
